This half term we are learning:

English: In English, we will be starting off the year by looking at two narratives called 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs' and 'Blue Umbrella'. We will be creating our own stories based on this work.

Maths: We will be completing work around addition and subtraction as well as thinking about place value and comparing numbers. We will also look at shapes and fractions during this half term.

Science: Our current topic is 'Light. We will be thinking about different sources of light, sun safety, reflective materials and how shadows are formed.

History: We will be learning about 'The Railway Revolution'. We will find out about developments during the Industrial Revolution and how these impacted on travel.

Geography: Our geographical work will be based around the question 'Where does our food come from?'. We will think about climate zones and how some of our favourite foods are produced. We will also be learning a lot about world maps.

Art: We will be evaluating the art of Wassily Kandinsky and trying to create our own pieces of work in his style using different materials.

Music: Our lessons will be focussed on learning about the recorder. We are finding out how we can play it in different ways and how we can change the sounds we create. We will also learn lots of new songs.

French: We will be learning about how to greet others, numbers and colours.

PSHE: In our PSHE lessons, will be looking at the topic 'Being Me in My World'.

PE: In PE this half-term, we will be learning handball skills with Mr Cross.

RE: We will be learning about signs and symbols in different religions.

Computing: In our computing lessons, we will be learning about Purple Mash and how to create branching databases.

Message from the teachers:

What an amazing start we have had to Year 3. The children have been an absolute delight and have settled into life at Flax Hill beautifully. They are working super hard and have been really engaged in our new topics. We are very proud teachers. Here are a few important pieces of information for you.
